Dr. RM.Alagappa Chettiar was a visionary who harbored affirm conviction that education is an absolute must for a human being to become productive, wholesome and humane. When India became independent, he answered the call of the Prime Minister to help educate India by spontaneously offering to set up an Arts College in Karaikudi. His munificent donations led to the inception of a string of educational institutions, which formed the basis for the establishment of the Alagappa University in 1985 by the Government of Tamil Nadu. The magnificent gift of 300 acres of land and fifteen lakhs of Rupees donated by Dr. RM. Alagappa Chettiar facilitated the Government of India to select Karaikudi as the seat of Central Electro Chemical Research Institute. Within a span of two decades, he demonstrated his versatility as a successful business tycoon, an intrepid academician with a vision to revolutionize his native town of Karaikudi single- handedly and changed the course of history by transforming a mere scrub jungle into a galaxy of educational institutions.

She founded Dr. (Mrs.) Umayal Ramanathan College for Women in 2006 and has actively worked to expand the infrastructure as well as the academic programmes and to provide vocational training to enable women in the community to prosper. She is enthusiastically involved in the field of education and social service. She serves as a Syndicate Member of the Alagappa University and as the Managing Trustee of the Dr. Alagappa Chettiar Educational Trust and the Asoka Charitable Trust. She has been an active member of the Social Welfare Board of Ramnad District and the Chairperson of Gangadeeswarar Temple, Chennai.

Dr. (Mrs.) Umayal Ramanathan was awarded the Doctor of Letters (Honoriscausa) by the Honourable Governor of Tamil Nadu. In recognition of her outstanding services to the society, Dr. Mrs. Umayal Ramanathan was awarded the prestigious Indira Gandhi Priyadarshini Award for National Integration and National Unity by the All India National Unity Conference on Indira Gandhi's seventy-fifth Birth Anniversary. She was also honored with a Doctorate Degree by the University of Madras on its 150th Convocation by His Excellency, the Governor of Tamil Nadu.

Dr. Ramanathan Vairavan, the grandson of Dr. RM. Alagappa Chettiar obtained his undergraduate degree in Chemical Engineering at the Alagappa College of Technology in Madras and went on to pursue his post – graduate education at Washington University, St. Louis, Missouri, USA, where he obtained a Master of Science degree in Biomedical Engineering and a Master's Degree in Business Administration. He has held various executive positions with the multinational company, Hoechst AG of Germany in the US, Germany and Singapore. He co-founded a US based company, Auto Genomics, engaged in the development of a novel DNA based technology of biochips, which enables doctors to provide effective therapy to patients based on their genetic makeup. This technology is set to revolutionize the process of diagnosis, monitoring and management leading to the emerging era of personalized medicine.

COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

Working hours	: 10.00 am to 3.45 pm
Tea break	: 11.40 am to 12.00 pm
Lunch break	: 12.50 pm to 1.45 pm

- The students should wear decent and proper dress.
- Students should compulsorily wear the ID card inside the college campus.
- Loss of ID card must be intimated to the college office immediately and replacement will be done at a cost of Rs.100.
- Mobile phones are strictly banned inside the college campus. Any student who is found using the mobile phones will be punished with penalty in addition to disciplinary proceedings if applicable.
- Students should follow the academic rules and regulations prescribed by Alagappa University. The hostel students should follow the rules and regulations of Alagappa hostel.
- Students should maintain discipline in the campus. A disciplinary committee appointed by the principal will enquire into any issue of the students' indiscipline and recommend suitable action to be taken.
- Students should use the facilities in the college without any damage. If any breakage is caused, action will be taken to correct and recover the cost, in addition to disciplinary proceedings.
- The vehicles of the students should be parked in the allotted parking area.
- Students are encouraged to take part in the Co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Periodical reports of the students regarding their attendance, progress and conduct will be informed to parents through regular Parent-Teachers meet.
- Students should get prior permission from the Head of the department and Principal to participate in any events organized by other Departments or other Institutions.

CLASSROOM ETIQUETTE

- Ragging is strictly prohibited. Any student who directly or indirectly commits or participates in ragging within or outside the campus will be punished with imprisonment up to 2 years and will be liable to a fine of Rs. 10,000. She shall also be dismissed from the institution.

- Students should be punctual and regular to their classes.
- Students are expected to be seated in their classrooms five minutes prior to the commencement of the class.
- Late comers should get permission for entering the class. However, admission to such students will be purely subject to the approval of the faculty concerned.
- Regular late comers will not be allowed to attend the classes without permission from the authority concerned in addition to penalty.
- A common prayer and thought for the day are said through the public address system everyday as a customary practice. Students are expected to observe silence during prayer time.
- Students' movement outside the classroom, in between the lecture classes is strictly prohibited. Students should maintain discipline inside the classroom.
- Students are expected to take care of their belongings.
- Students are instructed not to bring any valuables to the college.
- Students are expected to maintain the premises of the College tidy, clean and healthy and abstain from disfiguring the walls, desks or benches by sticking notices or scribbling and other similar un-civic acts.
- Students are expected to read all the notices put up on the College and Department Notice board.

LEAVE, PERMISSION AND ABSENTEEISM

- Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each class.
- Students must avail leave only after getting prior written permission. However sudden sickness or unforeseen circumstances may be exempted.
- In case of sick leave for more than three days, a leave letter signed by the parent/guardian enclosed with a medical certificate should be submitted to the concern Head of the Department through the Faculty in-charge, immediately when the student reports to the college. Parent or guardian should accompany the student if the above condition is violated.
- Students will not be allowed to take leave during Internal Assessment and Model Examination. However, for genuine reasons, she may be allowed to take up the test on any other day with prior permission from the concern Head of the Department and Principal.
- Students who absent themselves for the tests without valid

reason and prior permission from the concern Head of the Department will not be permitted to take up the next assessment examination.

- 100% attendance is recommended for class test, assessment tests and model examinations.

MENTORING SYSTEM

- Students will be divided into groups with 15 to 20 students in each group and will be placed under the guidance of a faculty, who will be their mentor. The mentor will be mentoring the ward's progress in studies, conduct, attendance, health conditions, participation in Co-Curricular and extra- curricular activities.
- A personal file is maintained for each student to record her progress in studies, attendance and other aspects.
- The mentor will counsel their wards periodically for betterment of their wards in all the aspects.

UNIVERSITY REGULATIONS DURATION

The course is for a period of three years for UG and two years for PG. Each academic Year shall comprise of two semester viz. Odd and Even semesters. Odd semester shall be from June / July to October / November and Even Semester shall be from November / December to April/May. There shall be not less than 90 working days which shall comprise 450 teaching clock hours for each semester. (Excluding the days for the conduct of University End-Semester Examinations)

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction for all UG Programme is English except B.A.Tamil

Part IV- It consists of four categories:

 - a) Those who have not studied Tamil up to XII standard and taken a Non-Tamil language under Part I shall take Tamil comprising of two courses.
 - b) Those who have studied Tamil upto XII standard and taken a non-Tamil language under Part I shall take advanced Tamil comprising of two core subjects.
 - c) Others can choose non-major elective comprising of two compulsory courses, viz. Communicative English in First Semester and Effective Employability Skills in Third Semester.
- ii) Skill-based Subjects (III, IV, V & VI Semester)
- iii) Value Education (IV Semester)
- iv) Environmental Studies (II Semester)

- There will be a Model Exam to prepare the students for the end semester examinations.
- Students are expected to score above 50% marks in all the subjects in the assessment examinations as their internal marks will be strictly awarded in accordance with the performance in the Internal Assessments.
- Student who scores less than 50% in any one of the subjects should write the re-test and attend the remedial classes.
- Disciplinary actions will be taken against the student who is found guilty of malpractices in the examinations.

Grading

Once the marks of the CIA and end-semester examinations for each of the courses are available, they will be added. The marks thus obtained will then be graded.

From the second semester onwards the total performance within a semester and continuous performance starting from the first semester are indicated respectively by Grade Point Average (GPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA). These two are calculated by the following formulae.

$$\text{GPA} = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^n C_i G_{ii}}{\sum_{i=1}^n C_i}$$

Where 'C_i' is the Credit earned for the Course in any semester; 'G_i' is the Grade Point obtained by the student for the Course and 'n' is the number of Courses passed in that CGPA=GPA of all the Courses starting from the first semester to the current semester.

Note: The GPA and CGPA shall be calculated separately for the following five parts:

Part I: LCs; Part II: ELCs and Part III: CCs, ACs, ECs, Part IV: NME, SBS, ES, VE, Part V: VP.

LIBRARY RULES

- Strict silence should be maintained in and around the Library. The Library is open on all working days of the College from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm. The library will remain closed on all holidays.
- Every UG student shall be permitted to borrow two books and every PG student shall be permitted to borrow three books from the library and can retain the books for 15 days only.
- Books will be issued to the students during any time of the library working hours. Reference books will not be lent out.
- Sub-lending of library books is strictly not allowed.
- The book should be returned on or before the due date mentioned in the due date slip of the book.
- Students who fail to return the books on or before the due date will have to pay penalty of Re.1/- per day from the due date. The cost of the book and penal fee will be charged from 15th day after the due date from the students.
- A student will lose the privilege of borrowing book if she repeatedly returns the books late or damages the books in any form and the fine will be levied three times of the cost of the book. The librarian reserves the right to recall any book at any time.
- Students must return all the Library books at the end of their course or at the time of their leaving the college whichever is earlier. All dues should be paid.
- Transfer Certificate and Conduct Certificate will not be issued to the students unless all the books due from them are returned.
- Personal belongings such as bags, Tiffin boxes and other books should not be taken into the Library.
- Delicate handling of books is indispensable; students should not spoil the books by scribbling or folding the corners of the pages.
- If a book is damaged or lost, the person responsible for it shall supply a new copy of the book or pay the cost of the book as per the norms of the Library.
